



DROUGHT TOLERANT PLANTS

Once established, the plants listed here will tolerate seasonal moisture and occasional water during the summer months. Promoting deep root growth is essential to establishing healthy plants that can survive periods of drought. All plants require deep watering for at least the first growing season. In addition, it is important to use a root stimulator and a fertilizer that facilitates root development at the time of planting.
