

Hardy Kiwi List



(Actinidia arguta) Attractive, vigorous, disease and pest free vines can quickly cover a wall, fence or arbor. Their delicious, lime-green fruit is sweeter and more flavorful than that of fuzzy kiwis and, with their smooth and tender skin, you can eat them like grapes. High in vitamins, low in sodium, cholesterol and calories. Prefer ½ day of sun to full sun and good drainage. Need one male for pollinating up to seven females. Fruit keeps 2-3 months when picked firm-ripe and refrigerated. Most begin bearing 3-4 years after planting. Fruit is about the size of a large grape.

Ananasnaja	Need	A very vigorous and productive vine which bears abundant crops of large, very sweet, spicy delicious fruit. Ripens in late Sept.	Fresh
Hardy Female	Need	Vigorous vines produce an abundance of aromatic, sweet fruit with smooth skin. Ripens Aug-Sept.	Fresh
Hardy Male	Pollinator	Selected for profuse bloom, it makes an attractive vine which pollinates females.	
Issai	Self	Oblong fruit has smooth skin and sweet flesh. Vine has more compact growth habit than other hardy kiwis and often begins bearing the year after planting. Ripens late August.	Fresh
