

VARIETY	POLLEN	SEASON	DESCRIPTION	USE
Carpathian (English)	Self-but higher yields with another variety nearby	Late fall	Plump, thin-shelled, medium-sized walnut with full flavor, excellent quality. Pest and disease resistant. Nuts fall free of husk when ripe. Hardy to -30 F.	Baking & fresh.
Manregion Sweet (English)	Need	Mid to late October	Large nuts with light kernels, round to elongated. Bloom earlier than Franqette. Heavy producer. Good mild flavor.	Baking & fresh. Good pollinator for other varieties

CHESTNUTS

VARIETY	POLLEN	SEASON	DESCRIPTION	USE
Chinese seedling	Need at least 2 trees for cross pollination	October	Large, sweet nuts, easy to peel, good quality. Beautiful large tree, produces up to 400 lbs. of nuts annually	Fresh, roasted, steamed

FILBERTS

Small attractive trees feature long, attractive male catkins fall-winter that pollinate via the wind tiny, pinkish-purple female flowers in winter. By fall abundant crops of tasty nuts fall to the ground for harvest. Grow 10-15'. All of these varieties are resistant to Eastern Filbert Blight.

Eta	Pollinates Jefferson and Theta	October	Round, medium-sized attractive nut, blanches well	Fresh, roasted and in baked goods or salads
Gamma	Pollinates Jefferson and Yamhill	September	Large, easy to crack nut with good flavor. Heavy bearer. Paint trunk with white paint to avoid sunburn.	Fresh, roasted or in baked goods or salads
Jefferson	Pollinates Gamma and Theta	October	Large nut with fine, rich flavor. Very productive. Paint trunk with white paint to avoid sunburn.	Fresh, roasted or in baked goods or salads
Theta	Pollinates Jefferson and Gamma	October	Small, round nuts .Good flavor. Excellent late pollinator.	Fresh, roasted or in baked goods or salads
