Cornus florida		25'	25'	White	Leaves are resistant to powdery mildew. Fall foliage is red.
C. florida	Cherokee Brave Dogwood	20-30'	20-30'	Clusters of single deep reddish pink flowers with white centers	This dogwood is a very vigorous grower. It exhibits great resistance to powdery mildew. The new growth emerges burgundy-red turning a rich dark green with age. Produces small red berries in late summer.
C. florida	Cherokee Chief Dogwood	16-20'	16-20'	single deepest pink bracts	One of the darkest pinks of all the dogwoods.
C. florida	Cherokee Princess Dogwood	16-20'	16-20'	White	Noted for consistently early and heavy bloom. Rust-red fall foliage.
C. florida 'Cloud Nine'	Cloud Nine Dogwood	16-20'	16-20'	Prolific snow white flowers bracts	Flowers profusely even when young. Graceful spreading habit with red berries in the fall among vivid orange and red colored leaves.
C. florida 'Grand Scarlet'	Grand Scarlet Dogwood	15'-20'	15'-20'	Dark reddish-pink	One of the darkest pinks of eastern dogwoods.

Cornus florida x nuttallii 'Eddie's White Wonder'	Eddie's White Wonder Dogwood	30-40'	16-20'	very large single white bracts	This is a cross of <u>Cornus.florida</u> and the native Pacific dogwood, <u>Cornus nuttallii</u> , which makes it a very hardy tree for our area. Disease resistant. Has hybrid vigor.
Cornus nuttallii 'Colrigo Giant'	Columbia River Giant Dogwood	30-40'	16-20'	huge white 6-8" across	Vigorous grower with upright habit, very large blooms (6"-8") appear in a late spring show; clone discovered in Columbia River Gorge.
