VARIETY	POLLEN	SEASON	DESCRIPTION	USE
<b>Black Satin (Thornless)</b>	Self	Mid to Late	Extra large, juicy, glossy berries; shine fades during ripening. Delicious, sweet flavor. Heavy yielding, semi-erect canes. Vigorous grower but does not sucker. Disease resistant.	Great fresh, in baked goods, preserved.
<b>Boysen</b>	Self	Mid	Large, juicy, soft berries. Full-bodied flavor, balancing sweet and tart. Vigorous plant with erect canes.	Well-suited for jams, pies, juices, flavoring.
<b>Chester (Thornless)</b>	Self	Late	Medium to large, very firm, juicy, sweet, mild berries. Excellent heat tolerance, semi-erect canes, vigorous, very productive.	Ideal used fresh or frozen; retains shape once thawed.
<b>Marion</b>	Self	Mid to Late	One of the most predominant cultivars on the market. Medium to large, soft texture, sweet, shiny berries. Excellent quality. Very high yields.	Superb when fresh, preserved, in pies, as flavoring.
<b>Obsidian</b>	Self	Early to Mid	Developed in Corvallis! Berries are large, moderately firm, dark, with a great, classic flavor. Ripens early and incredibly high yielding. Trailing growth habit.	Excellent when fresh. Can be preserved or in baked goods.
